College Planning

- Average: apply to 4-6 colleges
- Research Colleges
 - Consider what's important to you:
 Location, size, majors, campus life, cost
 - https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/college-search
- Do you have at *least one:*
 - Safe admittance school I can definitely get in.
 - Safe financial school I can definitely pay.

College Planning

- Do you understand the different types of admission?
 - Early Decision (Binding)- if admitted, you must attend
 - Early Action student finds out early if he/she is admitted but must reply by typical deadline of May 1st.
 - Regular Admission- may apply to many schools, review offers and financial aid and then make a choice
 - Rolling Admission schools review applications and admit students as they receive them instead of waiting for a specific deadline

College Planning Cont'd

- Know your deadlines for each college:
 - When is the application due?
 - When is the Financial Aid deadline?
- Where do you apply?
 - On the college's website
 - Through the <u>Common App</u> (<u>www.commonapp.org</u>)
 - Using send.edu <u>SENDedu</u>
- What else does the application require?
 - Transcript
 - Letters of Rec?
 - Essay?
 - Special requirements? (i.e. art portfolio, music audition, hours shadowing for PT school)

Transcript

- Your transcript is located in your community portal.
- ► This is your "unofficial transcript." Use as needed.
- Your GPA and class rank found under 11th grade
 - GPA is on a 4.0 weighted scale
- Are your test scores on your transcript?
 - If missing, log into College Board account, screenshot or print test scores and send to Counselor.
 - SOME colleges require SAT scores to be sent directly from the College Board while others will accept them as listed on your transcript

Requesting Transcripts

- Two ways to send a transcript:
 - 1) Electronic/Upload You enter counselor information/email address, I upload your transcript
 - Common Application is one example (One transcript upload is sent to all Common App schools)
 - 2) Paper copy that must be mailed

Read application directions carefully and follow up with your counselor if there's any confusion.

Letters of Recommendation

- ► Some colleges/scholarships require this, some don't.
- Ask recommender politely and make it personal (stop by room if you can, send detailed email if you must)
- Provide recommender with your unofficial transcript, a list of activities/community service, and/or resume.
- Make your polite request AND IN PERSON a minimum of two weeks in advance.
- Ask your recommender to send a copy to the Counseling Office to be placed in your file (electronic and paper copy).

Letters of Recommendation

- If you need a recommendation from your school counselor, you MUST complete the google information doc BEFORE he/she writes your letter.
 - Completing this enables your counselor to highlight and share information about you in a more genuine and substantial way (a more "robust letter" with better details)
 - > This google link will be sent to you by your school counselor

Requests for these letter of recommendations should be made AT LEAST two weeks in advance of when they are needed.

If you use the Common App, invite teachers as recommenders and they can simply upload the letter that they write for you

- Have at least one other person read to check for grammar, typos, style, and content – two people couldn't hurt!
- Save everything you write. You will likely be able to rework/edit an essay and use it multiple times.
- BUT when you reuse an essay make sure it still addresses the prompt and doesn't have college specific references.

College Admissions Tests

- Do your colleges require test scores this year?
- If you already took a test: Some colleges take scores off the transcript, others require you to send scores directly from the College Board/ACT. Read instructions carefully.

Scholarships

Scholarships from your College:

- Usually not a separate application, but ask the college
- Usually based on GPA and/or SAT scores
- Private colleges have more scholarship \$ to give.
- Class of 2021: 4.2 million dollars of scholarship \$ from their colleges

NCAA

- Planning to play Division I or Division II athletics?
- Register at the NCAA Clearinghouse
 - https://web3.ncaa.org/ecwr3/
- Important you meet the academic requirements
 - correct number of core classes
 - core GPA
 - SAT/ACT scores (submit official scores via College Board or ACT website)

Take ownership! This is your future and no one else can do it for you.

Organize yourself:

- Create a google sheet or use a notebook to keep track of usernames/passwords, deadlines, application requirements
- Use folders in your emails to organize emails from colleges, emails about scholarships
- Use bookmarks to save frequently used websites (college sites, scholarship page, transcript request, etc.)
- Pay attention to details. Read instructions slowly.

➤ Set aside the time – recommend you sign up for 5th period GS activity to force yourself to work on college/scholarship applications
